

IVHS Scholarship Policy

- An IVHS scholarship refers to the waiving of the normal fee charged for enrollment in a semester length course. Scholarships are provided both to schools and to individuals.
- Before a school that qualifies for scholarships may receive any scholarships, they must first pay for one enrollment.
- Schools qualify for scholarships based on the percentage of students that qualify for the federal free and reduced lunch program. Scholarships apply to each term (fall, spring, and summer). Qualifying schools fall into three categories:
 - Category 1: 25% - 39%; one scholarship after first paid enrollment.
Effective with the Fall 2008 term, Category 1 schools are no longer considered qualifying schools. Students from these schools may qualify for individual scholarships as described later in this policy.
 - Category 2: 40% - 59%; two scholarships after first paid enrollment
 - Category 3: 60% or greater; three scholarships after first paid enrollment
- After each 15 enrollments from the school, the school qualifies for additional scholarships based on the category.
- Students that aren't enrolled through a qualifying school **AND** are eligible for the federal free and reduced lunch program also qualify for scholarships. There is a limit of one scholarship per term and 4 scholarships over the student's IVHS career.

The following table illustrates the number of free enrollments a school would receive depending on their total number of enrollments. If the school is charging all or a part of the enrollment cost to the student, the school is free to allocate the free enrollments in any manner desired, including splitting the scholarship among multiple students.
