Note: In most cases, you will provide the original text for use in your media advisory. The IMSA Marketing and Communications Office is responsible for producing news releases and media advisories for major institutional news (commencement, new sophomore class, new board members, new program announcements, etc.). In most cases, however, we will be able to assist you with editing and proofreading, and, in fact, we recommend this for all new IMSA news releases and advisories. By doing this, we ensure that a coherent and consistent IMSA identity is portrayed to the media, regardless of where the news release originated in the Academy. Please help us to help you by involving us EARLY in the process so that we can schedule time to review and edit your news releases and advisories.

Because MarCom keeps the most updated media addresses (including e-mail and contact names), labels or e-mail addresses for media will continue to be provided by Marketing and Communications. In many cases, we can assist you in the mailing process if given enough advance notice, however, we would encourage other offices to distribute their own news releases when able.

The Media/Photo Advisory Checklist (below) and writing tipsheet should be referenced and used when at all possible. While some of these are stylistic preferences used by IMSA staff writers, many are rules of grammar and punctuation that should be followed at ALL times. When you are in doubt, DO NOT GUESS!! Andrews is a professor of law at the Chicago-Kent College of Law, and Director of the Institute for Science, Law and Technology at Illinois Institute of Technology. The National Law Journal named Andrews as one of "The 100 Most Influential Lawyers in America." Her many media appearances include "Nightline" and "The Oprah Show."

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
