How to Apply

- **Automatic** consideration/no additional information required – submit your admission application by admission or any noted priority deadline
- **Additional application** required – find, complete and submit required supplemental material found on the college site
- **Nomination** required – contact your CAC for nomination information

Scholarship Supplement Form

This form is for undergraduate students only.

The University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign Scholarship Supplement Form is an optional questionnaire for undergraduate students to complete online. The Office of Student Financial Aid (OSFA) uses this information to assist in identifying current and prospective undergraduate students who may be eligible for one or more scholarships.

All scholarships awarded by OSFA are based on financial need. To be considered for these scholarships the following criteria must be fulfilled:

1. You must be admitted or enrolled as an undergraduate student.
2. You must file for financial aid each academic year by completing and submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or Renewal FAFSA.
3. You must show financial need.

In addition to financial need, eligibility for one or more scholarships may depend on the answers to multiple questions on the questionnaire. **Note:** You may be asked to verify your responses to certain questions at a later time and your responses will be kept on file for up to five years. Please submit your University Identification Number (**UIN**) so your application can be processed.

MSU does not superscore tests. Students who choose to apply without a test score will be eligible for scholarships based on high school performance and a holistic review of their application material. 

Undergraduate Scholarships

Loyola also recognizes talented students through a variety of other scholarships that are awarded without consideration of financial need. Please review the following list of scholarship opportunities that will provide you, if eligible, with additional resources to help make your Loyola education more affordable. Review the descriptions below, and either call or e-mail for an application.

In order to be considered for any of Loyola University Chicago's academic scholarships, students must submit a completed Application for Undergraduate Admission (there is no separate scholarship application). Because freshmen should be admitted no later than February 1 for scholarship consideration, the completed [application](#) should be sent to the Undergraduate Admission Office by December 1. Transfer students must be admitted by June 1 for scholarship consideration.

Each application is carefully read and scholarships are competitively awarded based on outstanding academic achievement. Admission applications are reviewed for scholarship consideration on a first-come, first-served basis.

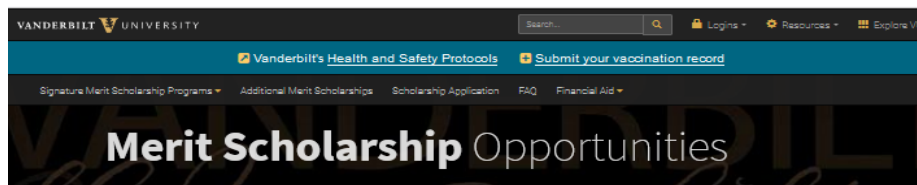
Scholarships are awarded to academically qualified students entering Fall 2021 based on information provided in the admission application process, without regard to financial need. Scholarship amounts range from \$10,000 to \$26,000 per year.

In some cases, if a student studies abroad through a program where Loyola aid can be applied, the Loyola aid may be reduced to reflect the same percentage coverage of tuition.

All applicants who apply for merit-based scholarships by the December 1 deadline will be considered whether or not test scores are submitted. Read [Vanderbilt's statement regarding test-optional policy for fall 2022 applicants](#).

Each year Vanderbilt awards merit-based scholarships to applicants who demonstrate exceptional accomplishment and intellectual promise. These students represent the top 1 percent of all freshman applicants to Vanderbilt, and with the limited number of merit scholarships available, the selection process is very competitive.

All merit-based scholarships offered at Vanderbilt are renewable through four years of undergraduate study as long as the recipient maintains satisfactory academic performance. Each of the four undergraduate schools awards a number of scholarships proportionate to the school's enrollment. Financial need is not a factor unless otherwise indicated.

LEARN MORE ABOUT VANDERBILT'S THREE SIGNATURE SCHOLARSHIPS:

- **Ingram Scholars** — students who plan to combine a professional or business career with an exceptional commitment to civic-minded service, innovation, an entrepreneurial spirit, and leadership. The program supports students who are committed to developing their personal roles in the solution to societal problems and who have the maturity and initiative to lead positive social change.
- **Cornelius Vanderbilt Scholars** — students who combine outstanding academic achievement with strong leadership and contributions outside the classroom.
- **Chancellor's Scholars** — students with outstanding high school records who have worked to build strong high school communities by bridging gaps among economically, socially, and racially diverse groups and who have demonstrated significant interest in issues of diversity education, tolerance, and social justice.

The approximately 250 recipients of these scholarships—one of our three signature scholarship programs—are guaranteed full-tuition awards plus summer stipends for study abroad, research or service projects.
