IMSA STUDENT SCHOOL IDs

We have been experiencing a high number of students not carrying their IMSA student ID in the main building. Specifically in the cafeteria where IDs must be scanned to account for meals. When some students are asked for their ID, they have been disrespectful to the food service employees. This will not be tolerated.

Per the IMSA Student Parent Handbook(pg.45):

IDENTIFICATION CARD

An identification card (ID) will be issued to all students at the beginning of the school year and must be worn and visible at all times while in the main academic building. This card must be presented upon request to any member of the faculty or staff during the school day or at any school function. Failure to do so subjects the student to disciplinary action. The ID card may be utilized in many ways (IRC, cafeteria, athletic events). For replacement of the ID card, the student must report to the Student Affairs Office. A processing fee of \$5 will be charged for replacement. This card is non-transferable.

We will be doing random stops in the hallways and will periodically monitor the cafeteria to ask for IDs now and for the remainder of the school year.

Please stop by the Student Affairs Office if you need a new ID. 2021-2022 broken IDs can be replaced for free as long as you bring the broken ID with you, to replace a lost ID it will cost \$5.

With regards to the student fees, information is accessible to the Parents online through MySchoolBucks.com. Attached is information, for the MySchoolBucks link in PowerSchool, for parents to pull up their fee payments for any academic year starting with 2019-2020.

There are two sets of instructions (in original email).

One document explains how to view all transactions and export them to an Excel spreadsheet. The other document explains how to view all transactions for PDF or print view.

The annual Student/Class Fee is a mandatory, non-refundable fee that is a condition of enrollment. Please check with your accountant regarding the treatment of these fees for income tax purposes.

2. Weather is always a challenge for outdoor activities during the spring season, here are the steps of communication for a cancellation.


- If the weather forecast becomes an issue for any spring sports and the event is cancelled the decision on cancelling the event will occur between 1 -2 pm on that day.
